Delinda Buie has worked with the University of Louisville's rare book collection since 1976. In 1978 she and City of Louisville Archivist Sharon Receveur took the original charter of Louisville, signed by Thomas Jefferson, to the Northeast Conservation Center (NEDCC) in Andover, MA for deacidification and mending. Over decades since she served on the Kentucky Archives Disaster Response Team, chaired the Archives / Preservation Subcommittee of the White House Conference on Library and Information Services in Kentucky, and headed preservation efforts at the University of Louisville while consulting on preservation in the region. In 2003 Delinda was part of the founding group for the MetaArchive of Southern Digital Culture, now MetaArchive Cooperative, an international collaborative for distributed digital preservation.

Kyna Herzinger joined the University of Louisville's Archives and Special Collections last October as the Archivist for Records Management. Having previously served the North Carolina State Archives as an appraisal archivist and records analyst, her primary responsibility was to establish retention periods for government records and identifying those with long-term, historical value. Drawing on over a decade's experience working with manuscript collections, institutional archives, and digital content, she has taught workshops and provided individual consultation about preserving documents, photographs, and electronic files.
